I am sure you have noticed the improvement in your child's handwriting. This month, they will practice writing their new letters, numbers 1-5 and their

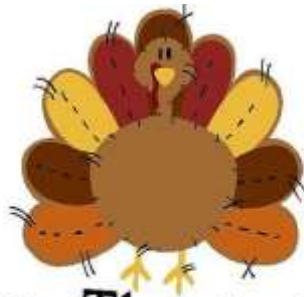
